# v. Potential products of exports for India

S.No.	Description	Rationale
1	Pharmaceutical products	Venezuelan pharmaceutical industry is severely affected by the lack of private investment and relies heavily on the imports for drugs and pharmaceuticals. India is one of the leading manufacturers and exporters of pharmaceuticals in the world and enjoys acceptance in the Venezuelan market due to its quality and competitive prices.
2	Auto-parts	India is one of the top manufacturers of auto-parts in the world. Venezuela is in dire need of auto-parts for all kinds of vehicles.
3	Food products	Local production of food has been severely affected by shortages of raw materials. The country is heavily dependent on imports to meet the demand. Basic foodstuffs such as maize, flour, grains, milk are scarce and may be exported by India.
4	Oil and gas machinery and spare parts	Venezuela needs oil and gas industry machinery and spare parts to reactivate their oil industry. The Venezuelan oil industry uses machinery and parts which are US standards compliant, and India manufactures such items compliant with US standards at lower rates.
5	Textiles	Venezuelan textile industry needs raw materials for its production. Indian fabrics are highly appreciated by the Venezuelan textile industry. Indian dresses are also liked in Venezuela.
6	Electric Steel	Venezuelan power generation industry requires an approximate of 5,326 metric tons of two grades of electric steel to be used in the recovery of 20,000 transformers in 2020.
7	Raw materials for plastic	Local plastic industry is operating at 20% capacity due to shortages of raw materials. The industry is currently importing materials from Brazil and Colombia, which have been found to be expensive by them.

#### INDIA-VENEZUELA

Ambassador of India in Venezuela met with industrialists from Carabobo: Representatives of different industrial chambers attended the invitation promoted by Governor Rafael Lacava, through the Secretary of Productive Economy and Tourism of Carabobo state, aimed at

strengthening ties with sister nations, on the occasion of the meeting with the Indian ambassador in Venezuela, Abhishek Singh. Read More

President Maduro affirms that Venezuelan economy grew double digits in the first semester: The president of Venezuela, Nicolás Maduro, assured this Wednesday that the country's economy grew "two digits in the first half of the year", although he did not specify the figure, since he indicated that this task corresponds to the Central Bank (BCV). Venezuelan pharmaceutical sector grew 12% in first semester: The president of the Chamber of the Pharmaceutical Industry (Cifar), Tito López, pointed out that the pharmaceutical sector has shown a slight growth in the first semester of 2022 of 12% compared to the first half of 2021, although in the year 2020 there is a slowdown in this growth in the sector. López highlighted that the pharmaceutical plants are working at 50% and 60% of their operating capacity, the importation of products is around 50% and joint work is being carried out between the engine of the sector and the ministry of industry to review which products can be imported due to greater demand. Repsol resumed agreement with PDVSA and received 3 million barrels of Venezuelan crude in July: The Repsol oil company confirmed that it resumed its oil debt agreement with Venezuela and that it received 3 million barrels of Venezuelan crude at its Spanish terminals in July, which will partially compensate for the weakening of its refining margins. Added that the use of heavy oils will provide a greater capacity to fill its cokers and optimize its conversion units. Read more.

Conindustria: Venezuela's industrial sector expects to grow 10% this year: The union representative pointed out that sales in the manufacturing sector are expected to increase this year as a result of a slowdown in inflation, which would improve the purchasing power of Venezuelans. Read more.
